Primary Years Programme

*** Evaluation August 2022***

The aim of IB programme evaluation is to support schools in continuously extending their capacity to implement and develop IB programmes to have a greater impact on student outcomes through the development of teacher and leader practice.

In August 2022 two trained IB staff from the Asia-Pacific region will conduct a virtual visit of our three campuses. The focus of the visit is on the school's efforts to develop the programme(s). The IB evaluation team engages the school in reflective conversations about ongoing programme development and asks the school to share its process, reflections, and transferable learning. The evaluation team assesses the school's development of each standard, identifies any requirements that the school does not have in place and suggests areas for future or further programme development.

During the evaluation visit, the IB evaluation team produces a report based on:

- school and programme documents provided during the preliminary review.
- the self-study questionnaire, including the school's self-assessment and evidence of programme development planning, analysis and reflection.
- the visit to the school to meet the various stakeholders and engage in candid discussions.

The evaluation report informs the ongoing development of the programme(s) and is the basis for revisions or updates to the school's programme development plans, or it may identify new areas for programme or continuum development and the creation of new plans.




Visible Wellbeing Coordinator's Article

In this issue of the school newsletter, I will focus on the coping pathway of the SEARCH Framework. This is not the pathway focus for all classes this term; however, each pathway always requires ongoing development of skills throughout a child's growth and development.

What is coping?

Students who can cope with the challenges that life presents them have developed skills such as resilience. This enables them to bounce back when the demands of life put them out of balance. Developing resilience to cope with demanding situations is an essential life skill.

How can we all help develop this skill?

Important aspects of building resilience are developing a growth mindset, strengthening relationships, being kind and embracing failure. These skills can be supported through games and activities such as picture puzzles or building where children learn to reason, problem solve and understand that life is not always fair. Helping your child learn the skills of giving compliments on skills and performance is also a wonderful way to support the development of resilience.

At home, I hope you enjoy playing games and giving compliments to your child to help support their coping with the tricky situations that they may come across. You should also be able to talk about your child's visible wellbeing learning that is occurring in their class too.

As we start this term, we are working through the Eco-Schools 7 Steps:

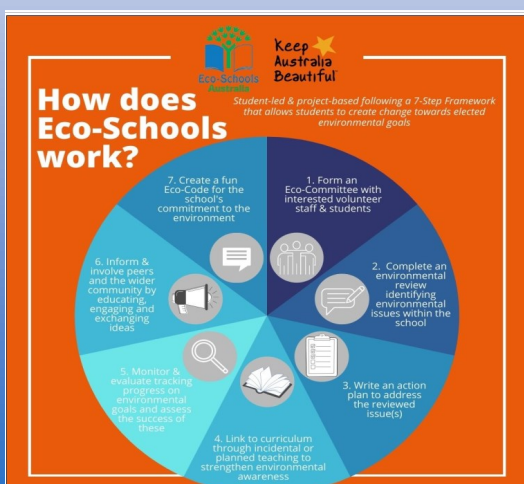
3. Create an action plan – Based on the Environmental Review students took part in on Green Day late last year – the committee have picked 3 focus areas for the Green Flag:

Terms + Conditions

- The promoter is City of Darwin Libraries (ABN 11 503 313 301) (Promoter) of Civic Centre, Harry Chan Ave, Darwin NT 0800.
- Entry is free.
- Entrants must be 18 years or under and reside in the Northern Territory at the time of writing the book (Entrants).
- Entries close on 27 August 2022.
- The aim of this competition is to create an original story using original text and original illustrations.
- Entries will be judged on originality, creative expression, storytelling, and presentation.
- An Entrant may seek assistance from a mentor to assist only with brainstorming ideas, story structure, and final assistance with proofing.
- All entries should be submitted as a hardcopy book, OR as a pdf if entering online (see details of the Entry Specifications).
- Entries must be submitted together by an individual Entrant or by the classroom teacher in the case of a school entry.
- Hard copy submissions require one original hardcopy of the books and one (1) additional hardcopy of the book with an entry form. A stapled black and white photocopy of the original book will be acceptable.
- Online submissions require one (1) pdf of the book to be uploaded to the website and a completed online entry form.
- The Promoter will acknowledge receipt of an entry via email to the email address provided in the entry form within 10 business days.
- Entries submitted for the award will not be returned.
- Books may be fiction, non-fiction, novels, picture books, anthologies, etc. but must comply with the Entry Specifications.
- There is no limit to the number of entries. Please provide one completed entry form for each book submitted.
- Winners will be announced in November 2022. You will be notified of event details through the email address provided in October 2022.
- A school entry must be submitted by the classroom teacher and authored by the majority of the class.
- It is the responsibility of all participating schools to seek the permission of parents or guardians for the students' work to be published in various formats.
- Where a school has submitted an entry, a permission form template is available to parents of the students involved on the Young Territory Author Awards website www.darwin.nt.gov.au/ytaa
- Where a school has submitted an entry, the students will only be identified by their first name and the name of the school that the student attends. Students' surnames will not be published.
- Where an individual has submitted an entry, that Entrant may be identified by the Entrant's first and last name.
- By submitting a completed entry form, an Entrant (and the parents and guardians of the Entrant) acknowledges and agrees:
 - All entries will be permanently held by the Promoter within the Young Territory Author Collection;
 - The Entrant will retain ownership of the original story and illustration and has the right to reproduce;
 - The Entrant grants the Promoter a licence to use the entries and any part of the entries;
 - That winners consent to the Promoter using their name, likeness, image and/or voice (including photographs, films or recordings, as well as all or any part of the Entrant's entry, in any media for the purpose of promoting and advertising the Young Territory Author Awards and any commercial or non-commercial purpose the Promoter sees fit for an unlimited period of time without remuneration; and
 - The Promoter may make an entry available to the public online to borrow.
- Each Entrant agrees that his or her entry is an original work.
- By submitting an entry, Entrants accept these Terms and Conditions of Entry.
- The Promoter reserves the right in its sole discretion to disqualify any entry that does not meet these Terms and Conditions of Entry.
- Judges will take into account the age of the Entrant.
- The judges' decision will be final.
