Recycling



We are continuing to collect a number of recycled items to continue to build on our recycling program.

We are collecting cans and bottles - envirobank orange bags will be sent home over the next few weeks. If you are not interested in collecting please let your child's teacher know or return the orange bag to the front office. Once they are full please return to the front office for collection. A new orange bag will be given to your child in exchange for the full bag.

We have also continued to partner with Wondersoft again this year to help reduce soft plastic waste in our environment.

Did you know?

In Australia, only 18%* of plastic packaging is recycled. Which is why Wonder recycling rewards was created. This is a fun and easy program for Aussie schools to recycle bread bags that might otherwise go to landfills and earn rewards points in the process.

Students are asked to bring in bread bags (any brand does not have to be Wondersoft) and place them in a box that will be kept in the front office.



Once collected, Wonder is going to turn the plastic into wonderful things like school play equipment. All registered schools can earn reward points to spend on new sports equipment, simply by collecting the bread bags and sending them to wondersoft.

ICT in Year 3

Now that we are in Year 3, we can use the laptops. We have been learning how to use the Google Drive. We learnt how to make our own folder, change the colour of it and create documents in our folder.

Easter Write up Kyle Cantrill - College Chaplain

This term we in chapel we have been reflecting on the times in scripture where Jesus was counter, cultural. We have focused on the challenges he made to the people of his time and how some of what he challenged them, can still be challenging to us today. We have explored topics such as Jesus seeing value in children when others didn't, Jesus seeing value in all people and wanting to share meals with outsiders, the challenge of loving your enemies and the ability to forgive people who have hurt you. These are all things that can be easily said but can be more challenging to act out in real life.

Leading up to Easter we have also explored the question why is Good Friday called Good Friday if it's a time used to reflect on the terrible torment that Jesus faced? There seems to be nothing good about that, right? The simple response to this question is; while we do reflect on the horrible things that happened to Jesus on Easter Friday, it is called good Friday, not because Jesus suffered but because of what his suffering means for us. Because Jesus died on the cross, we don't have to make regular animal sacrifices to be right with God nor do we have to follow a "perfect" person check list and try to be right with God through our own merit (Good deeds). Jesus has done the work on the cross. He is the sacrifice that was required for our wrong doings. It is only through him that we now can have a relationship with God.

This Easter when you have your hot cross buns, and your holo-Easter eggs use them as a reminder of what the true meaning of Easter is really about. The hot cross buns representing Jesus' death on the cross and the Holo-Easter eggs representing the tomb that was empty because Jesus is no longer dead but has risen. My hope and prayer this Easter is that God would bless each and every family over break and that we would truly reflect on what Jesus has done for us.


