Uniform Reminder


Line of Inquiry 2 — An inquiry into changes over time

For our Assembly, students worked in groups of 4-5 to research historical events or people and created plays to share their knowledge with others.


After choosing their groups and two events, students:

- brainstormed questions about their events/person
- researched their questions
- shared this with their group
- discussed how they could show the important parts of the event OR which part of the person's life would make a good play
- script development typed up on the Google Drive
- researched and created props for their plays
- worked with Miss Tolhurst to create the PowerPoint slides for their plays with pictures and sounds they needed
- practised and practised and practised

Throughout the unit, students had been exploring timelines and what BC/AD (or BCE/CE) means; so we ensured our plays ran in chronological order.






