In Weeks 7 and 8, we ran our school swimming program that saw all grades, T-5, head to Parap Pool for their swimming lessons. I was so proud of the way that the students were able to self-manage themselves and their belongings. There were plenty of smiles throughout the program and it was great to see their skills develop and confidence grow.

Tena Koutou Katoa (Hello to you all)

It has been an extremely busy term. Connecting before content (a restorative practice) has been highlighted and the need to maintain it as part of good practice in classrooms. This enables the ongoing building of relationships between students and teachers daily and sets the tone in classrooms for the day.

Rosie the therapy dog and wellbeing officer Mr Mike have continued to visit to support students in wellbeing. Groups of children continue to focus on communication and social skills with them.

It is important for students to continue to develop their emotional management. This is taught through the SEARCH framework here at school and encompasses emotional literacy, regulation of emotions, expression, mood, pleasant emotions, and gratitude.

Understanding emotions can impact how children function with others in different contexts. These skills need to be taught to children so they can know and manage their emotional reactions. You can help your child to recognise emotions and label them. They need to understand how to express and manage their emotions, so they know how, where, and when it is appropriate to do so, such as anger. Developing an understanding of emotions helps with motivation, concentration of tasks and perseverance. Together we can work to build emotional awareness and management of children so they can have respectful friendships and relationships.

Children also need to recognise and understand the emotions of others. Discussions with children allows them to imagine what others may be feeling so they begin to develop empathy. Children then can apply caring and empathy while building good relationships. Children also need to understand moods and learn that these emotional states can be managed by choosing the right mood for the right situation.

Building relationships and enhancing wellbeing through social interactions can be supported at home through games and other activities.







So, enjoy teaching your child or children about emotional management by creating a new game or two. Then make up some rules and enjoy playing it together over the holidays!

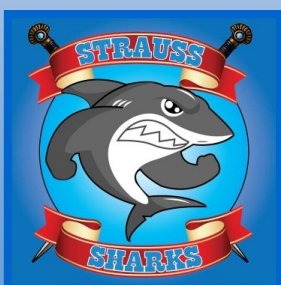

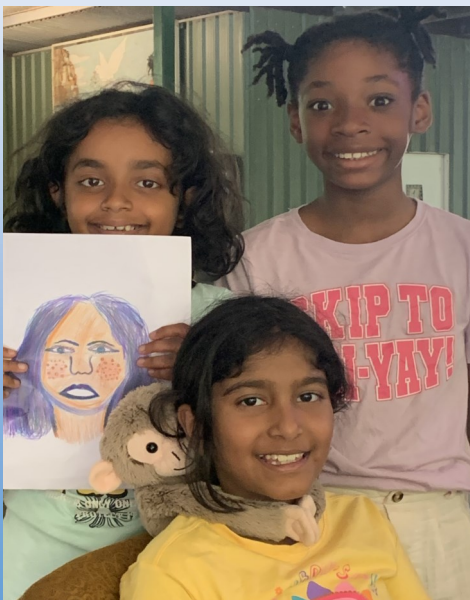

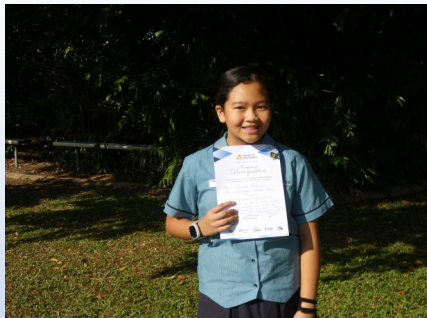

Year 1PC

In Year 1, the students made beautiful art pieces in response to their inquiries across a range of learning areas. These art pieces are a visual demonstration of the children's thinking and feelings about their learning and give them the opportunity to explore and express their creativity. Students listened to stories and found meaningful connections with their learning. In our inquiry unit 'How we organise ourselves' the students inquired into the Central Idea 'People communicate in different ways' such as using signs and symbols. They listened to the story 'Last stop on Market Street' by Matt de la Pena. They had discussions about the different signs you might see and worked together to make their own Market Street using different symbols for communication. Students also created city art using oil pastels and water colours. For National Reconciliation week, students listened to the story 'You and Me-Our Place' by Leonie Norrington. The students learnt about First Nation people having strong connections to special places. The students created their own art piece to their special place and explained their own connections. In Art with Mrs Kitsos, students listened to the story 'Splish by the billabong' and looked at the illustrations. They were then inspired to make their own leaf art, paper bark art and clay seed ornaments.

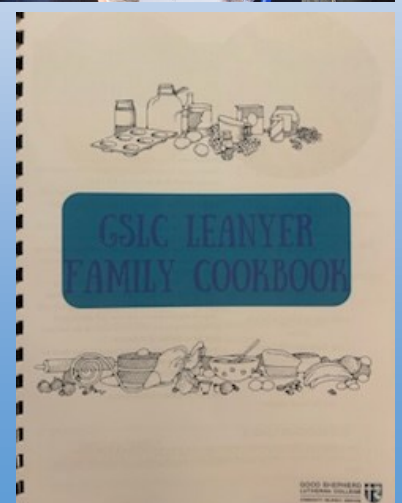
At the end of the day, we all played tag. Overall, we had lots of fun pretending to live life in the 1800's.

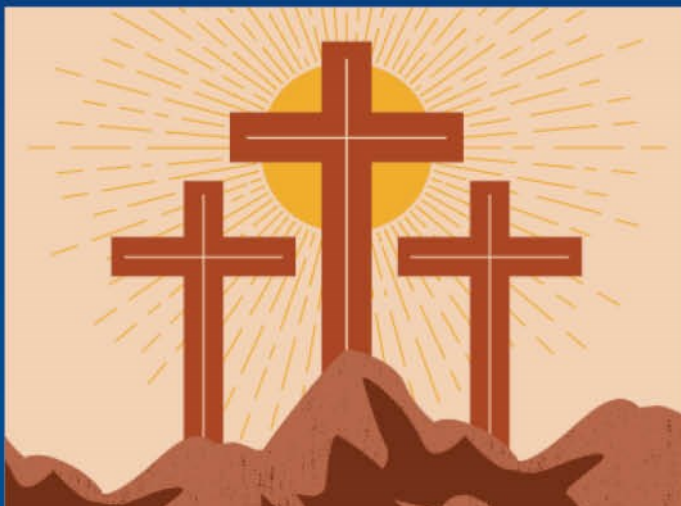

- Books may be fiction, non-fiction, novels, picture books, anthologies, etc, but must comply with the Entry Specifications.

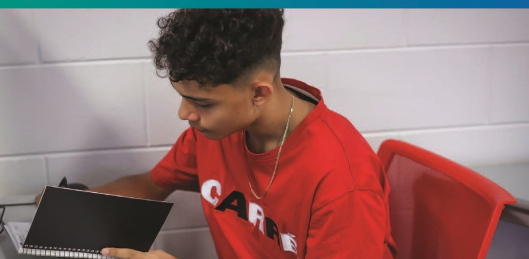
