

That's My Water!





As part of their World Studies, Year 7s were visited by Power and Water as part of the 'That's My Water' program at the beginning of term to discuss Darwin's current water usage and future sustainability. They then had the term to investigate issues around water consumption in the Territory, and come up with innovative ways to save water.

This week, Power and Water returned and students presented their findings. Areas of exploration included evaporation, filtration systems, water leaks, desalination plants and water usage around the home.

Year 7s outlined some amazing ideas for water conservation, including covers for large bodies of water to reduce water loss caused by evaporation, the use of water tanks to store rainwater, and water saving hardware including taps and shower heads.

Great work Year 7s!

Walk My Way

On Friday 6 September, Good Shepherd Lutheran College students, families and staff stepped out to bring love to life through Walk My Way! The twilight event involved completing 26 laps of the Howard Springs oval to raise money so that refugee children in East Africa can step into education.

What is Walk My Way?

Walk My Way is a fundraising walking challenge, raising money to help refugee children in East Africa go to school. Organised by ALWS (Australian Lutheran World Service), the Lutheran church's aid and development agency, each \$26 raised can help a refugee child go to school for a whole year. Since 2019, Walk My Way has helped more than 62,500 refugee children go to school. Education is a powerful way to change the future for refugee children and it is a gift that cannot be taken away.

The Good Shepherd Lutheran College community raised over \$4000, which will provide education to more than 150 students. Thank you to all who donated to this worthy cause, and to all who participated in this event!















Students join the Stage 2 Digital Technologies Pilot Program

Students Luke and Leo have been selected to participate in the prestigious Stage 2 Digital Technologies pilot program, an exceptional opportunity for our students to dive deep into cutting-edge technology fields.

The Stage 2 Digital Technologies program, supported by a collaboration between selected independent schools, The Array, Adelaide 42, and the Department of Education (DoE), is designed to immerse students in intensive learning blocks. Over the course of four terms, starting this term, Luke and Leo will engage in distinct "intensive blocks" of learning, including Web Development, AI & Machine Learning, Cyber Security.

During these blocks, Luke and Leo will travel to The Array to gain hands-on experience in each block outlined above that will increase their employability in an industry crying out for local NT employees. 


