After recess, the students cooled off with water play and an epic waterslide. Followed by a BBQ lunch.









TRANSITION

Term 3 has been an exciting and busy time in Transition, filled with celebrations, creativity, and hands-on learning. To kick-start the term, we celebrated 100 days of school with lots of fun activities, including dressing up as 100-year-olds! It was a fitting way to recognise the incredible progress our students have made.

TJC enjoyed creating a pop-art inspired painting, which we entered into the Royal Darwin Show – and to our delight, we won first place! As a class, we also decorated a cow cut-out to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the Cattlemen's Association and were awarded a Highly Commended ribbon.

Through our Unit of Inquiry, *Sharing the Planet*, TJC students explored animals, their habitats, diets, and physical features. Transition loved visiting the Territory Wildlife Park, seeing native animals in their natural habitats, and the highlight for many was handfeeding and patting the wallabies on the Woodland Walk. Building on this, the students researched and wrote information reports on an animal of their choice, created dioramas to represent their animal's habitat, and proudly presented their work to the school community.

In addition to animals, we also explored plants by planting grass seeds and observing their growth, further developing our understanding about the needs of living things. We even had special visits from an NT Parks and Wildlife Ranger who taught us about being Croc-Wise and a Turtle Scientist from Charles Darwin University, who shared with us the importance of keeping our waterways clean to protect local turtle species.

Book Week was a blast as we dressed up as our favourite book characters and took part in a range of fun literacy activities. Weekly Buddies sessions with 3CT have also been a wonderful way for our Transition students to build relationships with older students. Together, we celebrated Science Week by conducting experiments, recognised the Olympics and Paralympics with our own Potato Olympics, and made playdough, cloud dough, and oobleck while exploring chemical reactions.

In Literacy, TJC has worked hard every day on reading and writing, making great progress in dictation and recount writing. In Maths, alongside building number skills, students have become experts in data collection and graphing, surveying the car park for different coloured cars, using tally marks, and creating their own graphs.

As Term 3 wrapped up, we started our new Unit of Inquiry, *How We Organise Ourselves*. We've already learned about some important services in our community, including a memorable trip to the Airport Fire Station and a visit from St John Ambulance Services, where students learned about emergencies and even explored a real-life ambulance!

We finished up an amazing term with our Wellbeing Day, which was the perfect way to celebrate the hard work, learning, and growth of all the students in TJC. Term 3 has been filled with fun, excitement, and discovery, and we can't wait to continue our learning journey in Term 4!

















Year 1

The Year 1s had a great end to the term by presenting Chapel to the rest of the school They showed the school community what they had been learning about God and the Bible and led the Chapel with song, prayer, and short skits. The overall message is that God wants us to be in a relationship with Him and each other, by showing kindness and compassion to everyone, not just our friends. 




