TRANSITION

TJC have had a wonderful start to the second half of the school year. We have celebrated 100 wonderful days of school together by dressing up as 100 year olds and reflecting on the amazing progress of our youngest learners.

TJC have enjoyed learning about living things in our current Unit of Inquiry, 'Sharing the Planet'. Students have researched animals of interest and written information reports and showcased their understanding of their animals' habitats and needs by building impressive

After focusing on Mem Fox's classic children's story, Possum Magic, in Literacy, we loved visiting the Darwin Entertainment Centre to watch the live stage performance. This excursion was made possible by the Free Bus Transfer Program run by CDC NT Buses. As a class, TJC then researched and wrote about real possums found in Australia. More recently, we also visited the Territory Wildlife Park in Berry Springs to explore natural habitats, see a range of native animals and learn even more from the park's rangers. TJC also learnt that living things include plants, such as grass. We are currently observing and recording the growth and needs of our 'very hairy' grass heads.

Amongst all of our exciting ventures in TJC so far this term, our class art project won second place at the Royal Darwin Show! Students have also been reading to their big Buddies in 3CT and have enjoyed learning about 3D shapes.

During Science Week, TJC participated in the Smart Sparx Program. The program aims to educate young people about how to stay safe around fire. Finally, as part of our campus' Science Week activities, TJC opened their doors to families and the rest of the school to present their animal dioramas and information reports.











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SPACE

This term, **Year 3** have been learning about space. To introduce us to the unit, we completed a scavenger hunt around the school where we had to find the planets and collect information.

Then we began our physical training and tested our bodies to be an astronaut. We stretched and ran and jumped and caught things.

We learnt the order of the objects in our solar system

- the sun, the planets and the asteroid belt - and Miss
Boyce made up a fun game to help us.

We have been engineers and have created rovers, space stations, rocket ships and space colonies. We thought about the important features that need to be included for each one to function.

We participated in an escape room to save Astronaut Benson. After solving the clues and finding him on Mars, we all got mars bars.

We are excited to share this with you after our Week 7 Chapel on Friday 1 September.

Year 5

Our current UOI is 'How the World Works'. We've been exploring different types of energy; such as solar and electrical. Last week the students were given a project to do that required them to source the materials and then construct a way of cooking a marshmallow using only solar energy. The different groups used materials such as black paper, aluminum foil, paper plates and magnifying glasses. One group got inventive and used a glass bowl, to trap the heat inside. Another group used a cake tin in order to heat up the marshmallow faster. Everyone wrote up their own science experiment notes, covering the hypothesis, the materials, method and results. In the end, they noticed that the inside of the marshmallow had started to go gooey but the outside stayed firm. Another aspect of this unit has focused on technology, innovation and sustainability. Each student built their own dream house. They calculated the area and perimeter of it. Then they added renewable resources to their house. We have created a town. So far, the town has wind turbines, and each house has solar panels. We'll keep adding on to our town, as we continue to learn about different types of sustainable technology that help us in our everyday lives. Maybe they'll come up with some new kind of innovation that no one has thought of yet...


















Wellbeing
