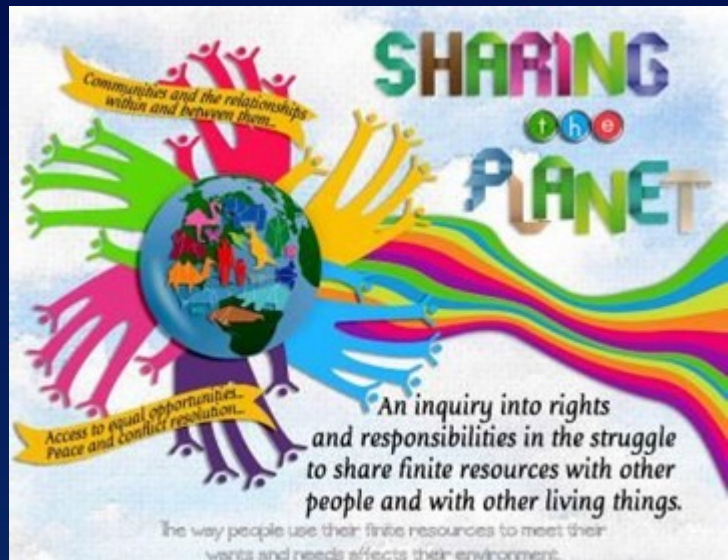

A number of our classes across the Junior Schools have recently undertaken their Unit of Inquiry with the Transdisciplinary Theme of “Sharing the Planet”. Many year levels were able to connect their Unit of Inquiry with our Christian Studies unit ‘Christian Living’, as the Key Idea was about how Christians have a responsibility in and for the world. This is one demonstration of transdisciplinary learning occurring in our Primary Years Programme.

ELC students explored how people can reduce, reuse, recycle and refuse waste to care for our planet.

Transition and Year 1 students inquired into how all living things have requirements to help them grow and stay healthy. Some of the resulting actions from this Unit of Inquiry was plants grown and cared for, and some chickens were hatched in one of the classrooms!

Year 2 students will continue their learning about how people make choices to support the sustainability of resources when they return to school after our holiday break. You may even notice at home that our students start to take action by considering their choices and the impact of these choices that they are making in their everyday life.

Year 3 students are also continuing on after the break their investigation into how living things adapt to their environment. Students are exploring the idea of factors that endanger living things and we notice that they often become crusaders in the cause against endangered animals.

Year 4 students inquired into how communities are affected by the distribution of resources in our world. It was eye-opening to consider how wealth is distributed around the world, especially understanding that wealth could mean resources other than money!

We love to celebrate any action that our students take from their learning and are always happy for parents to let us know of any examples that they have seen at home that they are willing to share.

# Strategic Plan Launch

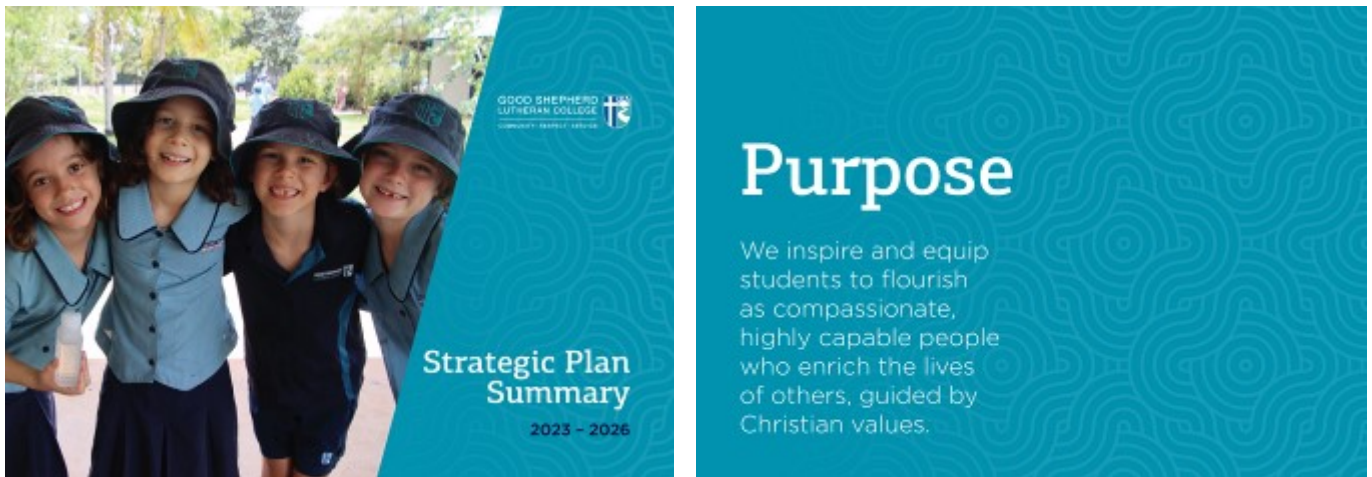
Following a 12-month consultation process, the 2023-2026 College Strategic Plan has now launched! You can view the Plan on the College website [here](#).

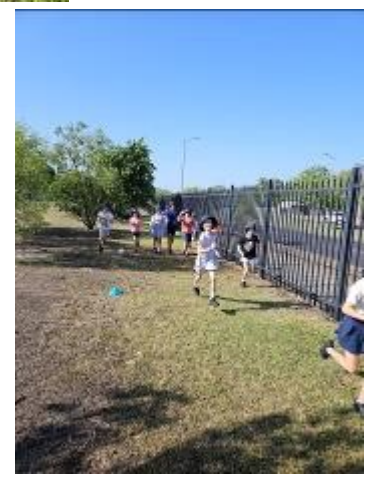

The Camp Quality Puppet Show visited our school recently. Students were educated through the performance about what cancer is and what happens when cancer is treated.

As a provocation for our new Unit Of Inquiry, 'How We Organise Ourselves', we had Dental Nurse, Jade Squirrell, come into our classroom for an incursion. Through this unit, we are inquiring into different services within our community. Students learnt about the importance of brushing twice a day, flossing in between our teeth and we were even able to test out some dental equipment. Everyone was sent home with a Colgate pack including a toothbrush and a mini toothpaste.



# YEAR 3

# SHARING THE PLANET

For our new unit, **Sharing the planet**, we have been learning about living things and their adaptations.

We learnt about Charles Darwin and his voyage around South America, Australasia and Africa. He observed living things and how they were different in different places.

Tom from Top End Critters brought us in a Blue Tongue Lizard to help us observe animal behaviours. In the last week of school, he brought in five different types of Blue Tongues from all around Australia. We observed their differences and learnt about how these differences help them adapt to their environments.

We read about carnivorous plants such as the Butterwort plant, Cobra Lily and Venus Flytrap. Next term we are going to be learning more about plant adaptations.



We used the laptops to help us with our research and found out about different animals from all around the world. Here's some of the things we have found out:

Jack I – I learnt that the Mimic Octopus can mimic different animals shape and behaviour.

Jethro – I learnt that Tigers have a very flexible spine that helps them jump high.

Ava - I learnt that Leafy Seadragons have a very flexible body to help them sway like seaweed and they have a long mouth so they can eat while they are camouflaged.

Jack M – I learnt that a Cuttlefish's eyes can see almost entirely behind them.

Sam - I learnt that Platypuses fur is completely waterproof.

Gabriel - I learnt that Pufferfish's puff up spikes to scare away predators.

Kaiden - I learnt that Musk Hogs have three stomachs to help them eat cactus.



Emmett - I learnt that Eagles can look so far away.

Daly - I learnt that a Wood Frog can freeze but not die.

Madeleine - I learnt that Lungfish can breathe out of water because they live in African floodplains that dry up in the Dry Season.

Chloe - I learnt that Stingrays don't have bones.

Jaydra - I learnt that Leaf-tailed Gecko's can camouflage by the colour of their skin.

Marley - I learnt that Emperor Penguins feather's are waterproof to keep them warm. They also have blubber.

Magenta - I learnt that a dolphin is the most agile swimmer in the world.

Jase - I learnt that Camels humps carry a supply of water to help them survive in the desert.



## YEAR 4 LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP

Last Thursday we ran a leadership workshop with Year 4 as they prepare to nominate for leadership roles next term.
