

At Good Shepherd Lutheran College Leanyer campus teachers are using affective statements in their classroom practice. These statements support schoolwide restorative practice and wellbeing in that they enable everyone to learn and understand that feelings come from how and if our individual needs are met.

Affective statements describe feelings and are a powerful way of teaching and modelling to students both positive and negative emotions. The development of social and emotional literacy helps students understand that there are varying degrees of emotions. For example, on a continuum anger might be expressed as furious, annoyed, or grim. Happiness might be felt as pleased, buoyant or ebullience or any other number of words.

The use of affective statements helps students begin to understand the impact of both positive and negative behaviours and the effects this has on others. These statements encourage or discourage desired behaviours whilst still maintaining good relationships between students and teachers.

Affective statements are mostly 'I' statements, explaining feelings and emotions followed by the effect it is having and the desired outcome.

For example, "When I (see hear experience), I feel (add the emotion word) because I (add the need, value, or care about word here).

As your child's first teacher, you could try using affective statements at home too. Rather than "Now you've got it" The affective statement could be "When I see you take on new challenges, I feel elated because you are developing your resilience."

Most of all enjoy teaching and learning with your child as we all work together in partnership to ensure each of our students' wellbeing is met, enabling each of them to cope with the demands of school especially at this time of year.
