Restorative practice continues to be implemented as a whole school approach at our Leanyer campus where we encourage student behaviour to be respectful and supportive of others. Students are listened to, give their own perspectives and find solutions to help fix problems. We continue to see and hear the positive effects of restorative practice around the school as students engage with and learn this process, enabling them to improve their own problem-solving abilities.

Mr. Mike and Rosie the therapy dog continue to visit us and support various groups of students across the school. We always welcome their presence each Tuesday here on the school campus.

Students enjoyed learning about health and wellbeing in vertical groups and participating in various activities for our Wellbeing Day. The activities promoted physical, mental, social, emotional and spiritual wellbeing. Students engaged in cooking, gardening, STEM, pottery, cricket and made prayer stones. This was followed with water play activities in the afternoon and an icy pole treat. All students had a great day as did the teachers!

Wellbeing of students continues to be taught in all classrooms with teaching and learning occurring through units of inquiry. Coping is one of the pathways of the SEARCH framework where students learn such skills as resilience, giving them the ability to bounce back in challenging situations. It is essential parents and teachers work at developing this life skill to enable students to cope when they face challenges.

Teaching about having a growth mindset, strengthening relationships, kindness and embracing failure all help improve the development of resilience. Such skills can be developed through games and activities such as building where students learn to reason and problem solving and where students learn that life is not always fair. Teaching children how to give compliments is a further way to support and development resilience.

Now the holidays are upon us, enjoy playing games and giving compliments to your child. This will help support them to cope with difficult situations that they may come across at school and in the community.








Concert and Disco

3JM Market Stall



Year 1PC

In our Unit of Inquiry-How the world works, 1PC students have been learning about the weather and how it impacts our lives. The students had discussions on how the natural world influences our lives and made hypotheses about how the weather affects our lives such as food production, how we live with seasonal change and how important weather and the solar system are to our world. The students identified the natural, managed and constructed features of local places, the ways in which places changed, and how they can be cared for by people. The students developed questions and made predictions as well as collected and recorded information and data from observations which they wrote in their own weather journals. The students were very interested in a tree outside of the class that lost its' leaves so we documented it through photos and observations. The students learnt about the solar system and how important the sun and moon are to our world.
