Primary Year Programme

Approaches to Learning Skills in a PYP School

At our school, we believe that learning how to learn is one of the most important skills a child can develop. To support this, we focus on Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills, which help students of all ages become independent, self-motivated learners.

The ATL skills fall into five key categories:



These skills are designed to help children ask thoughtful questions, set meaningful goals, and work toward their dreams with determination. We share your child's progress in these areas during each Unit of Inquiry in the end of semester reports.

While these five skills are presented as separate categories, they're closely connected. For example, developing strong communication skills often involves thinking critically or managing time effectively. Teachers help students strengthen these skills by modelling them, using specific strategies, and providing feedback and opportunities for practice.

What makes ATL skills so valuable is that they are learnable and adaptable. With practice, children can apply them to all kinds of situations—whether it's solving a tricky math problem, working on a group project, or planning their week.

Our teachers intentionally incorporate ATL skills into everyday learning. When a new skill is introduced, they guide students step-by-step and provide plenty of opportunities to practise in different contexts. Over time, this approach helps students take ownership of their learning and become active participants in their education.

By combining ATL skills with the attributes of the Learner Profile, we aim to nurture curious, resilient, and reflective students who see learning as something they do for themselves, not just something that happens to them.

Together, we can help your child grow into a confident, self-regulated learner who's ready to tackle any challenge.

All teachers had the opportunity to further strengthen relationships with all students at connect and care time in the playground. Students have felt comfort in knowing they can speak to any teacher at our school.

We have continued to see our school values; community, respect & service affirmed across the school through kindness, fairness, perseverance, self-regulation and leadership, in our students across the campus this year.

Where necessary, restorative conversations have been practiced with student's welcoming the chance to be listened to, be heard and in many cases beginning to learn how to resolve their own conflicts.

Our teachers have continued strengthening their own knowledge and skills in restorative practice where they have applied best practice research-based ideas. Of special note is affective statements that have supported students understanding of emotional granularity.

Thank you to the teachers who supported wellbeing outside of the classroom through extra-curricular activities such as knitting, crochet, running and music.

They will need a supportive environment to express their emotions, build resilience and develop the skills to deal with the changes they will face in the coming weeks.
