RECYCLING

We are continuing to collect a number of recycled items We are collecting cans and bottles - envirobank orange bags are available from the front office. Once they are full please return to the front office for collection. A new orange bag will be given to your child in exchange for the full bag.

We have also continued to partner with Wondersoft again this year to help reduce soft plastic waste in our environment.

Did you know?

In Australia, only 18%* of plastic packaging is recycled. Which is why wonder recycling rewards was created. This is a fun and easy program for Aussie schools to recycle bread bags that might otherwise go to landfills and earn rewards points in the process.

Students are asked to bring in bread bags (any brand does not have to be Wondersoft) and place them in a box that will be kept in the front office.



Once collected, Wonder is going to turn the plastic into wonderful things like school play equipment. All registered schools can earn reward points to spend on new sports equipment, simply by collecting the bread bags and sending them to wondersoft.

Bombing of Darwin Commemorative Ceremony







On 19 February 1943, 83 years ago, Darwin faced a devastating attack the first of at least 64 air raids on the Top End, which continued for 18 months until November. The Bombing of Darwin left hundreds of servicemen and civilians dead, with countless others injured.

The Bombing of Darwin commemorative ceremony at the Darwin Cenotaph was a time for reflection, and a chance to honour the servicemen, servicewomen, and civilians who defended our country, those who selflessly helped others, those who endured the aftermath, and those who tragically lost their lives.

Good Shepherd Lutheran College Captains from all campuses, along with staff, attended the event to pay tribute to those affected by the attacks. As a mark of respect and remembrance, our captains laid wreaths on behalf of the College.

I am married with two children; Harry is 9 years old and Charlotte is 11. We also have two red heelers, Chilli and Mala.






YEAR 5 Renae Perryman

I look forward to being a part of the school community and contributing to the physical education program.






