Tech Quest

Over two exciting days, our library transformed into buzzing innovation hubs as students took part in the Future Tech Quest, a unique, hands-on opportunity to collaborate, create, and compete in the world of digital problem-solving.

The Tech Quest is a collaborative, project-based learning experience where students worked in teams to design and pitch their very own "Me Module" – a digital solution to a real-world challenge. From idea to pitch, students explored the full journey of innovation, supported by staff and real-world experts from ShareRing, an Australian-based tech company leading the way in online safety and digital identity verification.

As part of the Age Assurance Technology Trials, an Australian Government initiative designed to enforce age restrictions on social media, students engaged directly with ShareRing's cutting-edge tools, learning firsthand how technology can be used to protect young people online. Students were guided through a secure digital registration process temporary IDs provided for the event, ensuring a safe and educational experience for all.

Teams brainstormed, built, and pitched their solutions, and the creativity on display was nothing short of inspiring. From tackling mental health in the digital age to reimagining how we verify identity online, students showcased bold ideas and brilliant teamwork.

Well done to the winning team: Gemma N, Maya S, Natalia L and Lillian A, who designed an app to identify online cat phishing. Each member walked away with a brand-new iPad, and their app will go into development to be made available to the public!

Every participating student will receive a certificate of participation, celebrating their contribution to innovation and online safety in the digital world. A huge thank you goes out to our friends at ShareRing, the dedicated staff, and of course, our incredible students for making the Future Tech Quest a huge success.

Year 6 Canberra Trip







Our Year 6 students recently returned from an action-packed week in Canberra, and what a week it was! The annual visit to our nation's capital gave students the chance to deepen their understanding of Australian history, government, science, sport, and culture through a range of handson and eye-opening experiences.

At Questacon, students were immersed in interactive exhibits including robotics and lightning demonstrations that made science come alive!

A highlight for many was the visit to Parliament House, where students toured the chambers and even stepped into the shoes of our leaders with a fun and insightful role-play session.

Over at the National Electoral Education Centre, students participated in a mock election (a perfectly timed activity!).

The trip also included a tour of the Australian Institute of Sport, where students were inspired by stories of elite athletes and got to test their own abilities in the interactive Sportex zone.

Time for reflection came during a visit to the Australian War Memorial, where students paid their respects and learned about the stories behind the symbols of national service and sacrifice.

Visits to the French and German Embassies allowed students to extend their language learning and global awareness.

Rounding out the experience were visits to the Royal Australian Mint, where students discovered how coins are made, and the National Museum of Australia, where they explored fascinating exhibits on our country's diverse history and heritage.

It was a memorable week filled with learning, laughter, and new perspectives that will no doubt stay with our students for years to come.

School Immunisations!

Immunisations protects your adolescent against vaccine preventable diseases.

Every year, the adolescent immunisation program provides free and recommended vaccines to year 7 and year 9 students across the Northern Territory.

Consent forms for the adolescent vaccines have been sent home with students for parents / guardians to sign. It is important that you return your child's vaccination consent form to the school as soon as possible. If you do not want your child vaccinated at school it is important to return the consent form indicating this. More information and digital consent forms can also be completed online at School Immunisation Program, once completed please return to your school.

A Meningococcal B vaccine program is currently available in the NT until December 2026 to all adolescents 15-19 years of age. Book an appointment at your community care centre or GP to ensure your child doesn't miss out <u>Find a community care centre | NT.GOV.AU</u>


