


Learning Enrichment

The Learning Enrichment team at Good Shepherd Lutheran College consists of Learning Enrichment Teachers, Learning Support Officers and an Occupational Therapist. This team works closely with Teachers, Heads of Schools, Wellbeing Coordinators, and other key staff across all campuses to support the diverse learning needs of our students, from Early Learning through to Year 12.

The Learning Enrichment team fosters and develops an inclusive environment in which all students, no matter their learning needs, can experience success and reach their individual potential within the College community. Through supporting teaching staff and students with learning difficulties, social needs and high intellectual potential, Good Shepherd Lutheran College can ensure all children are fully supported in their educational journey.



Wellbeing







At Good Shepherd Lutheran College, we are committed to creating a supportive, nurturing environment where every student can excel academically, socially, and emotionally.

Our comprehensive wellbeing programs help students foster positive relationships, build resilience and a strong sense of self-worth. We prioritise mental health through regular Wellbeing Days, where students engage in activities that promote relaxation, mindfulness, and community connection. Our Defence School Mentor plays a crucial role in linking children of serving ADF members with the College community through activities and providing information and individual support.

The College has dedicated Wellbeing Coordinators who, alongside pastoral care teams and other key staff, work closely with students to ensure they feel valued, heard, and equipped to flourish in all aspects of life.



Community Involvement

Good Shepherd Lutheran College values its relationships with families as well as the wider community and local organisations.

Throughout the year, the College hosts many events and community engagement initiatives, and encourages families to be involved!

Early Learning

Good Shepherd Lutheran College has an Early Learning Centre (ELC) at each campus.

Qualified educators lead an innovative, play-based curriculum for 3-4 year old children, where they are encouraged to question, investigate and learn about the world around them, preparing them for their first year of Junior School.

Children can attend full-time or part-time with the choice of school hours (8.15am - 2.30pm); or long day care (7.00am - 5.30pm).

Advantages of an ELC within a Junior School:

- Outstanding educational programs, based on the Early Learning Framework and the IB Primary Years Programme.
- Involvement in Junior campus activities, assemblies and special events.
- Access to Junior school learning resources and College library for literacy enrichment.
- Use of Junior school facilities and play equipment.
- Support from College staff, including Learning Enrichment teachers.

In addition, children will experience a smooth pathway into school entry. The ELC is the starting point for your child's Good Shepherd journey, extending right through to Year 12.

Primary Years

Good Shepherd Lutheran College has a junior school at each campus, offering the International Baccalaureatte Primary Years Programme. This curriculum encourages students to take ownership of their learning, to increase confidence and self-motivation.
