Before then, please take note of the following reminders:

**Uniform & Presentation:** Please revisit our Uniform Policy over the break – Further guidelines will be provided at the beginning of 2026. Students require: Fully black shoes with white socks. Jewellery must meet College guidelines, and acrylics, false nails or coloured nails are not permitted. Hair must be kept clean and worn tied back if it is longer than shoulder length.

**Canteen Payments:** From 2026, students will need a physical card for canteen purchases. Mobile phones cannot be used for tap-and-pay.

#### Digital Safety & Device use in 2026

Good Shepherd remains committed to providing a safe, focused, and positive learning environment. Our approach to mobile phones, smart watches and online behaviour aligns with NT Government expectations and our College Cyber Safety Policy.

#### **Mobile Phones & Smart Watches**

To minimise distraction, protect privacy and support wellbeing:

- Years 6–12 may carry a mobile phone, but devices must be off and away all day and stored securely.
- Smart watches must be on flight mode so calls and messages cannot be sent or received.
- Devices may only be used when approved for a teacher-directed activity, a documented medical need, or during an emergency under staff direction.
- Students needing phone access for personal reasons (e.g. work) may do so at Student Services with permission.



### Office Information

This aligns with the NT policy designed to reduce classroom disruption, prevent cyberbullying, encourage social interaction, and promote a safe learning environment.

**Cyber Safety:** Cyber safety is a shared responsibility across students, staff and families. The College uses a whole-school approach that includes:

- · Explicit teaching of age-appropriate cyber safety and respectful online behaviour
- Staff training in digital safety and cyberbullying prevention
- Regular communication with families on current issues and reporting pathways
- · Promoting positive online conduct and responsible bystander behaviour
- · Monitoring trends and reviewing incidents to strengthen prevention strategies

Our focus is on helping students navigate the online world safely, protecting their privacy, treating others with respect, and knowing when and how to seek help. Together, these measures support a safe, respectful, and digitally responsible school community. Families are encouraged to have regular conversations about safe online practices.

## Subject in Focus - Christian Studies

As we approach the end of the year, students across the College have been engaging in rich and meaningful Christian Studies learning experiences—opportunities designed to help them reflect on faith, service, purpose, and their place in the world.

Year 6 students spent the term learning about our responsibility to care for the environment. Our Year 7 students are concluding their studies by exploring the three major monotheistic religions: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. Through comparing beliefs, practices, and historical origins, they are gaining an appreciation of both the uniqueness and the shared foundations of these faith traditions.

Across the remaining year levels, the focus has been centred on our College value of Service.

In Year 8, students have continued their service unit by reflecting on why people choose to serve, who in our community most needs support, and what practical acts of service look like in everyday life. They have been encouraged to consider how service can become a natural and purposeful part of their own routines and relationships. A guest speaker was scheduled to present on volunteerism; however, the incursion was cancelled due to Cyclone Fina.

Year 9 students have devoted Term 4 to service through the Rite Journey program. Each week, a different class has volunteered at Foodbank—packing, pricing, unloading goods, and gaining valuable insight into how the organisation supports those facing hardship. Students also coordinated a highly successful Rite Journey Bake Sale, raising over \$1000 for the RSPCA, with the popular "Guess the Lolly Jar" competition drawing plenty of attention. The year concluded with the Rite Journey Homecoming at the Darwin Sailing Club, where students and families came together to celebrate the cohort's growth, maturity, and transition toward adulthood.

In Year 10, students have been exploring vocation. The reflected deeply on what it means to live a purposeful life and how future pathways, careers, and personal strengths can align with a sense of calling.

Finally, our Year 11 SRM students have been investigating service organisations around the world. Their research has focused on the origins of these organisations, the needs they address, and the communities they are committed to serving.

As we move toward Christmas, these units of study remind us of the heart of the season: a time of generosity, compassion, and hope. In the Lutheran tradition, we understand Christmas as both a celebration of Christ's coming into the world and an invitation to reflect His love through service to others. We thank our students for the ways they have embodied these values throughout the term and encourage our College community to continue practising kindness, gratitude, and service as we enter this festive season. May the message of Christmas inspire us all to bring light and care to those around us.
